In Loving Memory of My Maternal Aunt, Mrs. Corrie Cook Fernandez, LPN

On the 40th Anniversary of Her Homegoing, on November 26, 1978.

I will forever cherish the many memories of spending my childhood summer vacations from Baltimore, Maryland; with her & my aunt, Irene Cook, in Pacolet, South Carolina; in the 1970s.

I didn't realize how special & loved she was by so many people in Pacolet, until I was around eight years old!

It was then that I began to learn her story, she had brought half of the town into life! She was the nurse, as well as midwife, from 1932 – 1964, for Pacolet's beloved longtime only doctor, the late Dr. Robert Dennis Hill Senior, MD (1899 – 1964). She began working for Dr. Hill around age 15, as a nurse maid to his two children, then at age 16, she began accompanying him on house calls.

In June 1932, she delivered her first baby in Pacolet, her baby sister, my mother, Gladys Cook Norris (1932 – 2011).

She went on to deliver hundred hundreds of other babies, during her tenure with Dr. Hill, with having the honor of several being named after her (Corrie Littlejohn Oglesby, Corrie Smith, Corrie Wannamaker, Corrie Shippy Gist & Corrie Ann Graham).

After Dr. Hill's passing in 1964, she continued nursing in the Pacolet community for Dr. Hill's successor, Dr. Thomas F Drake, MD until his untimely passing in 1968.

For the next two years, She served Pacolet's medical needs solo, continuing to see patients at Dr. Hill & Dr. Drake's Former Clinic.


Around 1970 she took a position as private nurse to the owner & founder of the former Community Cash grocery store food chain, Mr. & Mrs. Broadus R. Littlejohn Senior.

She remained with the Littlejohn's until just weeks before her untimely passing, at age 63, in 1978.


