

Pacolet Soldiers Killed in World War 1

They are pretty well forgotten these days, but Pacolet lost at least three men to the carnage of World War 1. I have very little information about these three except their names. They are:

Corporal Rufus H. Genoble Corporal Smith J. Harvey Private John Reed

More is known about Cpl. Genoble than the other two because of a letter written by a fellow soldier. The soldier was 1st Lt. Lucius Samuel Bolt Jr. from Laurens, SC. Like Rufus Genoble, Lt. Bolt was in Company D, of the 81st Infantry "Wildcat" Division in France. Cpl. Genoble was in the platoon commanded by Lt. Bolt.

On Nov. 19, 1918, Lt. Bolt wrote to his parents in Laurens. In this letter he told how Rufus Genoble had been the first man in the "Wildcat" Division to be killed. He gave no more details. When he wrote the letter on Nov. 19, the War had been over for a week. The Armistice had been signed over a week before on Nov. 11, 1918. At that time, the 81st Divison had been in France since August, 1918, a period of 3 months.

In the late 1920's the War Department of the United States compiled a list of mothers and widows of deceased soldiers killed in World War I and offered to send them to their loved one's final resting place in Europe. Cpl. Genoble's mother, Mrs. Sarah Louise Genoble, is on the list but it is not known if she ever actually made the trip.
